

The theme of our 2022 Annual Report, "Find Your Wild" was inspired by an enthusiastic conversation the Parks Council staff had with educators at a community consultation meeting in early 2022. Our discussion centered on helping students regain their curiosity and spark for learning following the Covid 19 pandemic. Students heavily relied on technology for education, socialization, and entertainment through the pandemic. Teachers observed that technology was a mixed blessing in that it left some youth feeling physically isolated, socially withdrawn with a lack of tangible connection to the local environment. One teacher remarked that students needed to be re-awakened and to "find their wild." Our eyes opened wide! This is what we do best!

In retrospect, the pandemic left most everybody needing to be recharged or re-awakened. We all enjoy the smell of fresh air, hearing the flow of a river or seeing the emergence of spring. We believe everyone has an intrinsic connection to the natural world, and that developing or enhancing a connection to nature teaches us about ourselves, our community, and what feeds our spark for learning and life. Established in 2007, the Eagle Point Provincial Park and Blue Rapids Provincial Recreation Area, (together referred to as the Eagle Point-Blue Rapids Park System) are in central Alberta just east of the Town of Drayton Valley. Together they protect the natural and cultural landscape features a 53 km stretch of the North Saskatchewan River Valley.
